Let's Talk Month is a national campaign to emphasize the importance of conversations between young people and the adults they trust about sex and relationships.

Did you know:

- the percentage of teens who say it would be easier for them to postpone sexual activity and avoid teen pregnancy if they were able to have more open, honest conversations with their parents is **87%**?
- the percentage of teens who say they have not had a single conversation like that with their parents is **37%**?

What can you do?

This month, agencies and organizations across the state are hosting events to celebrate Let's Talk Month. Working together, parents and their communities can provide the information and skills necessary to prepare young people become healthy adults. Here are some ideas about how you can help:
