## May 7, 2008 is the National Day to Prevent Teen Pregnancy

The National Day to Prevent Teen Pregnancy is an opportunity for Georgians to encourage teens to learn about the importance of avoiding teen pregnancy.

### Did you know that in Georgia:

- Nearly 18,000 babies a year are born to teenage girls?
- Nearly 28% of all teen pregnancies are repeat pregnancies?
- Only 7 other states have higher teen birth rates than ours?

### What can you do?

During the month of May, the National Campaign to Prevent Teen Pregnancy is hosting an online Quiz at [www.stayteen.org](http://www.stayteen.org) that challenges teens, ages 13 and older, to think carefully about what they might do in certain tough situations and helps them to recognize that sex has consequences.

- Encourage teens to take the Quiz and make computers accessible to them on May 7<sup>th</sup> or during the entire month of May
- Use the Quiz as a conversation starter to discuss teen pregnancy prevention issues with teens
- Organize a local community event to raise awareness about teen pregnancy prevention issues.
