

Aligning Community Systems for Optimal Adolescent Health ACSOAH in Macon-Bibb

In partnership with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, GCAPP and Community Health Solutions are leading the way in a teen pregnancy prevention project for some of the most vulnerable young people in Central Georgia. Working with youth, youth-serving professionals, parents, community partners and leaders, and other youth advocates, GCAPP will impact 3,600 disenfranchised youth throughout Macon-Bibb between the ages of 13-19 years old over the project's three-year period.

Now in it's third year, the project's most immediate objectives are to improve adolescent health in Macon-Bibb by bringing the community together to accomplish the following goals:

- Increase youth connections by building stable and developmental healthy relationships
- Increase youth awareness and access to quality, traditional, and alternative educational career paths
- Increase access to culturally responsive mental health support services
- Increase parental engagement by strengthening parentchild communication
- Empower 3,600 youth by June 30, 2023

Highlights:

- Enrolled **3,300 youth** since inception of the program and on track to surpass serving 3,600 teens
- Established 28 Youth Action
 Teams
- Held free Workshops for Parents & Caregivers: How to be an 'Askable Adult'
- Hosted the Macon-Bibb Adolescent Health Fair in Spring 2022
- Held Youth Empowerment Summit for 300+ youth in December 2022
