**THE CDC RECOMMENDS** everyone between the ages of 13 and 64 get tested for HIV at least once as part of routine healthcare. Young people between the ages of 15 and 24 account for some of the highest cases in Georgia. HIV is manageable and it's as easy as ever to get tested to know one's status. Confidential, free and/or low cost testing is available and accessible throughout Georgia. The GCAPP HIV Resource Guide provides information about testing options as well as treatment availability in every region of the state. Whether someone is looking to simply get tested, or needs HIV treatment services, the GCAPP Resource Guide is an important and helpful tool.
